- Earns his second PGA TOUR victory in his 94th start at the age of 29 years, 19 days
- Picks up first individual victory on TOUR (2025 Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Andrew Novak)
- Fourth multiple winner on TOUR this season, joining Rory McIlroy (3), Scottie Scheffler (2) and Sepp Straka (2)
- Becomes the fourth player to win a stroke-play and team event in the same season since the Zurich Classic of New Orleans became a team event in 2017 and first since Rory McIlroy (2024)
 - Becomes fourth player to eagle the first hole in the final round and win on TOUR (since 1983)

 - Phil Mickelson/2009 The Genesis Invitational
 - Chris Kirk/2015 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Played the first three holes (Nos. 1-3) at Colonial Country Club at 10-under for the week
- Earns 500 points and moves from No. 21 to No. 5 in the FedExCup standings
- Moves from No. 52 to No. 24 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Improves to 1-for-3 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on TOUR; in addition, held the 54-hole lead in the Zurich Classic in New Orleans with teammate Andrew Novak en route to victory
- Becomes sixth 36-hole leader/co-leader and 13th 54-hole leader/co-leader to win stroke-play events this season
- Victory comes in his third start at the Charles Schwab Challenge (T52/2023, MC/2024, Won/2025)

Additional Player Notes

- 36- and 54-hole co-leader Matti Schmid (2nd/-11) finishes with a career-best runner-up in 79th start (previous best: T3/2024 Shriners Children's Open, 3rd/2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship); will make his first signature event start at next week's the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- Making his seventh start at the Charles Schwab Challenge and first since 2020, Bud Cauley (3rd/-9) earns solo-third, matching his career-best finish (3rd/2011 Procore Championship, 3rd/2012 Wyndham Championship, T3/2017 The American Express)
- England's **Tommy Fleetwood** (T4/-8) records his 41st top-10 finish in his 156th start, the most top 10 finishes without a win on the PGA TOUR since 1983 (second: 34/Brett Quigley)
- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (T4/-8) was seeking to become the second player to win the Charles Schwab Challenge and THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson in the same season (Ben Hogan/1946); earns fourth consecutive top-five finish at Colonial (2nd/2022, T3/2023, T2/2024, T4/2025)
