Notable

 Cullen is hosting two professional events with just 18 days in between the two. He joins these GCSAA superintendents hosting multiple professional events in the same year: Pete Bachman, Pebble Beach (AT&T in January and PURE Insurance in September), Grayson Grainger, Tiburon (this week's Chubb Classic, CME Group Tour in November and Grant Thornton in December) and Ken Yates, Black Desert Resort (Black Desert Championships for LPGA in May and for PGA TOUR in October).

• Cullen has had an extremely busy stretch with the two PGA events plus Feb. 1-3 he hosted GCSAA golf tournaments, which were part of the annual GCSAA Conference and Trade Show and had 358 superintendents and others in the industry playing his North and South courses those three days.

• Also on Tuesday, Feb. 3 he hosted morning and afternoon educational sessions titled "Mastering Tournament Prep and Recovery" as part of the GCSAA conference and Trade Show.

• Heading into the Farmers, Cullen said this is the driest winter he has experienced in his nine years with the last significant rain event in early April.

• Great weather has produced a significant increase in number of rounds, which has resulted in increase in wear and tear on the property.

• Yardages and cuts are the same as they were for the Farmers Insurance Open.
