THE SENIOR PGA TOUR DIVISION BOARD

The Senior PGA TOUR, formerly a department within the overall structure of the PGA TOUR, became an operating division of the PGA TOUR in October, 1985. The restructuring, along with the naming of a new seven-man Senior PGA TOUR Division Board, gives the increasingly-popular Senior circuit greater ability to deal with its particular policies, opportunities and issues.

The seven-member Board, is composed of the following:

Three Player Directors, elected by the Senior PGA TOUR membership.

Three Independent Directors, representing the public interest. One serves as Chairman of the Board.

One PGA Director, who is the Honorary President of the PGA of America.

A Player Advisory Council consults with the Policy Board.

ABOUT THE COMMISSIONER

Deane R. Beman

Entering his 13th year as Commissioner of the PGA TOUR, Deane R. Beman has overseen the most explosive period of growth in the TOUR's history, since succeeding Joseph C. Dey, Jr., on March 1, 1974.

During the Beman administration, the "business side" of the PGA TOUR has shown dramatic growth and now includes many heretofore uncharted paths, each designed to help encourage continued prosperity and to ensure the future of the game.

PGA TOUR Investments, Inc., though still in its relative infancy after just four years, has already

grown to include 14 "Stadium Golf" facilities nationally. In addition to providing state-ofthe-art tournament golf arenas, Tournament Players Clubs have been instrumental in the growth of PGA TOUR assets, which have climbed from \$730,000 to more than \$32 million during the Beman era.

PGA TOUR Properties, the joint marketing venture of the TOUR and PGA of America, continues to make steady progress in its quest to open new opportunities in golf for commercial sponsors and the TOUR's members. This year's introduction of the enormous Vantage Cup/Nabisco Challenge promotion is the latest example of marketing's efforts.

PGA TOUR Productions, introduced last year, is the TOUR's first-ever in-house TV/audio-visual production entity, the creative possibilities of which are nearly limitless. The long-range goals of Productions include the ability to produce the TOUR's non-network, live golf telecasts, though a prudent step-at-a-time approach is being followed in the start-up years.

Other important innovations introduced during the Beman administration include a professional Agronomy department, the Official Statistics program, electronic Vantage Scoreboards, and the Diversified Products physical conditioning facility.

Competitively, the Beman era has witnessed the birth of the Senior PGA TOUR. Launched in 1980 with two events and \$250,000 in prize money, the 1986 Senior TOUR will feature 31 events and \$7.5 million in prize money. Both TOURs combined offer over 80 tournaments and \$30 million.

The Player Retirement Plan, inaugurated in 1983, has already contributed \$3 million toward the future benefit of active Plan participants, and larger contributions are expected in future years.

Charity, easily the TOUR's leading money winner during the Beman era, continues to benefit at a yearly record pace. Contributions by American Golf Sponsors to charitable organizations rose to another unprecedented total of \$11.3 million in 1985 and will be substantially supplemented this year by \$2 million in the new Nabisco Challenge Program.

During his active years as a player, Beman established an enviable slate of accomplishments, compiling one of the great amateur records of all time. He won United States Amateur titles in 1960 and 1963 and the British Amateur championship in 1959. As an amateur, Beman was a member of four Walker Cup teams, four World Amateur Cup teams and three U.S. Americas Cup squads.

At the age of 29, in 1967, he left a prosperous insurance brokerage firm in Bethesda, MD, to join the PGA TOUR as a full-time player. During his six-year professional career, he won the 1969 Texas Open, 1970 Greater Milwaukee Open, 1972 Quad Cities Open and 1973 Shrine-Robinson Classic.



MAZDA PRESENTS THE SENIOR PGA TOUR

Introduced prior to the 1985 season, Mazda Motors of America, Inc., joined the Senior PGA TOUR as the Presenting Sponsor for a three-year period.

"We're delighted that Mazda has made such a substantial commitment to the Senior PGA TOUR, " said Commissioner Deane R. Beman. "Mazda's involvement has helped to assure the continued growth and prosperity we have witnessed on the Senior TOUR for the past five years. We look forward to a long and mutually beneficial relationship."

Mazda's commitment to the Senior TOUR includes:

• The exclusive presenting sponsorship of all non-network telecasts of Senior PGA TOUR events for the three year period, with a minimum of six telecasts planned per year. In addition, Mazda is underwriting a substantial portion of the production costs for each broadcast in the Mazda Series.

• Sponsorship of the Senior TOUR's first-ever season long bonus pool. Senior TOUR players compete for points offered in the Mazda Bonus Pool with the top-ten point-winners sharing in the \$300,000 Bonus Pool. Points are awarded through a maximum of 60 places in each event with the winning player collecting 150 Mazda Bonus Pool points, the player finishing second receiving 98, the third-place finisher 70, down to the 60th-place finisher earning two points, DOUBLE Bonus Pool points are awarded in all ESPN-televised open, full-field events. The leading point-winner earns \$125,000.

• Sponsorship of a season-ending special event, The Mazda Champions, offering the richest first-place prize money in professional golf: \$500,000. The 36-hole, four-ball stroke play event pairs the top 10 Senior TOUR Bonus Pool point-winners, plus the top two players from the Lifetime Career money list (not otherwise exempt), with the top-12 LPGA players from a coinciding year-long Mazda Bonus Pool points race. The 1985 Mazda Champions, contested at the Tryall Golf & Beach Club outside of Montego Bay, Jamaica, included a total purse of \$730,000.

JAMAICA BECOMES "AN OFFICIAL GOLF DESTINATION OF THE PGA TOUR

The PGA TOUR and the country of Jamaica reached an agreement early in 1986 whereby Jamaica became "An Official Golf Destination of the PGA TOUR." The announcement was made by PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane R. Beman and Senator, the Honourable Hugh Hart, Minister of Tourism, Mining & Energy for Jamaica.

The agreement, the first of its kind ever made by the PGA TOUR, allows use of the PGA TOUR logo by Jamaica for marketing and promotional purposes. In turn, the PGA TOUR will promote golf-related travel to Jamaica through its corporate sponsores, licensees and Tournament Players Club network; design outings and travel packages geared toward Jamaica, and offer its services as consultants in golf course management and agronomy.

"We're extremely pleased to enter this unique agreement with a country such as Jamaica," said Commissioner Beman. "We're excited about the prospects of this agreement, creating a variety of events where Jamaica can play host, and look forward to the development of an outstanding relationship."

"It is indeed a pleasure and an honor for Jamaica to receive this distinction," noted Minister Hart. "I feel the PGA TOUR understands not only the objectives of this country to become a premier golf destination, but to further enhance its image as a premier tourist destination as well."

Tryall Golf & Beach Club, overlooking the Caribbean Sea on Jamaica's North Coast just west of Montego Bay, played host this past December to the inaugural \$730,000 Mazda Champions. The innovative event paired the top players from the Senior PGA TOUR with the top LPGA players in a 36-hole best ball event. The winning team, Don January and Alice Miller, split golf's richest first place prize, \$500,000, for their efforts over the 6,407-yard, par 72 Tryall layout.

The Mazda Champions is again scheduled for the Tryall Golf & Beach Club this December.

The agreement also called for the creation of a highlights film by PGA TOUR Productions which featured not only the Mazda Champions, but tourism and cultural aspects of Jamaica as well.

"People are well aware of the natural beauty, scenic terrain and temperate climate that Jamaica offers," added Minister Hart, "and our association with the PGA TOUR will help people all over the world realize and discover the challenging and majestic layouts Jamaica's golf courses offer."

SENIOR PGA TOUR ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Eligibility for Exempt Status in 1986:
 - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round.
 - b. Top 36 Available players on Lifetime Career Money List.
 - c. Top eight available players from the Final 1985 Senior PGA TOUR Official Money List (not otherwise exempt) provided they finished in the top 40 of the 1985 Official Money List.
 - d. Top four available players from the 1985 Senior PGA TOUR National Qualifying Tournament, in order of finish in the Tournament.
 - e. Winners of Senior PGA TOUR events, if not otherwise exempt, gain one-year exemptions from the date of the win.
- 2. Eligibility for Associate Member Status (not exempt):
 - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round.
 - b. Must be active member of PGA of America.
- 3. Eligibility for Non-Senior PGA TOUR Members:
 - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round.
 - b. Two spots in each tournament field from Open Qualifying.
 - c. Two sponsors' exemptions per tournament. (In those events where, due to available daylight, the field is expanded from 52 to 54 players, two additional players not otherwise exempt shall be granted sponsor exemptions. One such player shall be a National Qualifier and the other such player shall be from among the top 60 players on the All-Time Career Money List. If all available players in these categories are otherwise exempt, in which case spots may revert to unrestricted sponsor exemptions). Players shall be eligible for sponsor exemptions as follows:
 - (i) SENIOR PGA TOUR members-unlimited number of sponsor's exemptions.
 - (ii) Other players-three such sponsors' exemptions per calendar year.

NOTE: The above criteria is based upon standard 52-man format for open Senior PGA TOUR events. Invitational events may employe varying criteria.

While growing up, played golf left-handed for two years. After turning pro in 1942, worked in war plant and served in U.S. Army for 14 months in 1944-45. Built and operated a driving range before joining PGA TOUR full-time in 1948. Played on TOUR full-time through 1962. Among eight TOUR victories were two playoff wins, the first in 1953 Azalea Open over Chandler Harper, the second over Don January in the 1961 PGA Championship at Olympia Fields, IL. No one at Olympia Fields will forget final day of regulation when he finished birdie-par-birdie to the companion January, sinking respective putts measuring 25,40 and 52 feet, then won next day's playoff by one stroke with a 67. In 1964 PGA Championship at Columbus (OH) CC, he seemingly made great shots from all corners of the golf course and holed putts from one end of the state to the other to win by three over Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer. ... Several years earlier, he was an outstanding football and basketball player at St. Xavier High School in Louisville; on Sept. 3, 1952, he was critically injured when a car in which he was a passenger failed to make a curve and crashed. He suffered a broken pelvis, back injuries, a brain concussion and internal injuries. He was paralyzed from the waist down and unconscious for 13 days, and hospitalized for 96 days. When he finally regained the use of his legs, he could still play golf. After winning junior golf titles in Kentucky, he met Bear Bryant, then coach at Univ. of Kentucky, who, after taking the Texas A&M helm, offered Bobby a scholarship of play for the Aggies... Was honored by the Golf Writers Association of America in 1962 with the Ben Hogan award for his courageous comeback... Had another terrifying moment at the 1975 Western Open when he felt the effects of a bolt of lightning and was taken to the hospital with Lee Trevino and Jerry Heard; has not played with the same effectiveness since.





One of the great stories in golf, he started playing cross-handed as a kid, played football briefly for Florida A&M University, then, while in the service in 1952, injured his left knee during a parachute exercise at Fort Bragg, N.C. After several operations failed to repair the damage, the knee was finally fused in 1965. He started playing golf again after a 13-year layoff, turned professional in 1967 and qualified for the PGA TOUR in 1970. He won the 1971 Kemper-Ashville Open, but several operations on his right knee forced him off the TOUR a few years later. . . . Joining the Senior TOUR in 1981, he's improved steadily since, finishing 18th on last year's money list. . . . Has bottled eyeritis, a condition that temporarily blinds him in his right eye. . . Uses a 50-inch putter that weighs three and a half pounds which he constructed himself and says 'cures the yips'. . . MEDIA REGULATIONS

The General Regulations

The following regulations are to be followed by all members of the Media:

- Remain close up against gallery ropes in such a way as to appear to be a part of the gallery at all times. An ARM BAND is necessary.
- Players are not to be distracted during play. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their round.
- DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions prior to their round except by prior arrangement with the player.
- Do not disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards.

Working Press Regulations

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

- 1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
- 2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
- Do not interview during play. The leading players each day and others requested will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

Tape Recorder Regulations

- 1. All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or Clubhouse.
- 2. Tape recorders are NOT permitted in the locker room.
- 3. Tape recorders are NOT permitted within the playing area of the golf course.
- 4. If an interview is to be taped in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by prior arrangement with the player and up against the ropes and NOT in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

This Tournament is essentially for the players and spectators. Fair play requires that there be no noise or other distractions. The interests of all others must be subordinated to the players interests. The result of any one shot could decide the Tournament.

Only accredited photographers for RECOGNIZED NEWS MEDIA will be permitted to take pictures during the Tournament. Photography will be restricted to news use. Commercial and personal photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a Pro-Am).

The following regulations apply to accredited news and television photographers and videotape cameramen as a condition of the privilege of taking pictures:

General-All Photographers

A photographer must not ask a player to pose or in any way verbally distract a player during a round.

If a player or an official requests that no photographs be taken in a certain situation, the request must be honored immediately, without discussion.

A camera must not be pointed at a player about to make a stroke in any manner which might tend to disturb him or distract his attention.

At the 9th and the 18th greens, photographers must not approach, delay or distract a player until he has checked, signed and returned his scorecard to the proper official. Under the Rules of Golf, a player turning in an incorrect scorecard in stroke play may be disqualified.

Cameras are not permitted in the locker room.

Use of golf carts or other means of transportation on the course during tournament play is prohibited.

Photography Regulations (cont'd)

Still Photographers

Only still photographers to whom armbands have been issued will be permitted inside gallery ropes. They must station themselves immediately inside such ropes, and not more than an ARM'S LENGTH FROM THE ROPES, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open. Any photographer who violates this regulation will forfeit the right to working inside the ropes and possibly to work at the tournament.

Close-up action shots are prohibited.

All pictures must be taken at appreciable distances, as far from the players as possible and from angles which are not acute to the line of play.

When working at a green, photographers must not position themselves directly in a player's putting line.

Pictures, even from a distance, may not be made until the player has completed his stroke. The photographer must not release his camera shutter until the shot is made.

Television/Videotape Cameramen

Television and videotape filming may be done from inside the gallery ropes, or from areas approved by the PGA TOUR. All camera personnel who have been issued PHOTO armbands will be permitted inside the gallery lines but this does not include other members of the crew. Camera personnel must station themselves immediately inside the gallery lines, not more than an arm's length from those lines, so as to blend into the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open.

Filiming may be done from such locations during a player's stroke, provided modern equipment that produces a minimum of noise is used.

Post-round interviews must be filmed far enough away from the arena of play to eliminate the possibility of distraction to those competing.

. . .

Difficulties will be avoided if photographers are fair and will treat players as they themselves would wish to be treated in similar circumstances.

The cooperation of all photographers will be appreciated.
